WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

The other day I had an experience that all of you have undoubtedly had many times. The doorbell rang and as I opened the door I was greeted by two friendly people who wanted to start up a conversation. It just so happened that they saw the sign outside the church that said, "Why is God's name such a big deal?" and they wanted to talk to me about it. A few minutes into the conversation I realized that they were Jehovah's Witnesses and I politely explained to them that I believe in the Triune God – Father, Son and Holy Spirit. I mentioned to them that I'm not interested in a debate and they decided to leave. The whole experience reminded me again of how important it is for Christians to know what they believe in. Since we differ on beliefs about the Trinity, where Jesus Christ came from and how he died, a physical vs. spiritual resurrection, as well as eternity, I want to explain some of these differences between Christianity and Jehovah's Witnesses in this month's issue of the Chimes.

Origin

Jehovah Witnesses was started in the 1870's by a man named Charles Russell. He was the one that God supposedly spoke to and gave wisdom to concerning what their belief was supposed to be. At the age of 17 he witnessed to a friend and the friend's belief ended up being stronger than his and convinced him that a loving God would not send people to hell. Russell took some beliefs from Christianity, mixed them with some of his own made up beliefs and started a new movement. In fact, he prophesied the return of Christ in 1874. When Jesus did not return he made another prophecy that he would return in 1914. He was wrong again. As the movement began to grow, Russell started to publish magazines to spread his message. They later became known as the *Watchtower* magazines published by the Watchtower Bible and Tract Society right here in Brooklyn NY. The society leaders hold complete authority over the Jehovah Witnesses and it tells each church what to do. Watchtower magazine prints over 18 million copies every month in more than 100 languages.

Statistics

Jehovah's Witnesses have more than 6 million members in 230 countries and territories. About 1 in every 277 people in the U.S. is a Jehovah's Witness. They claim to be the one true church in the world. They believe that they alone possess the truth and that if you are not a JW, you are choosing to serve Satan or choosing to not even know God. They are not allowed to enter a Christian church and think very lowly of Christian ministers. In fact they believe that Christian ministers are spreading the word of Satan.

What they believe

According to them only 144,000 Jehovah's Witnesses will go to heaven to spend eternity with God. This they get from a wrong interpretation of Revelation 7:4. The other Jehovah's Witnesses will receive recreated bodies and live on a recreated earth. Earth will be restored to a paradise, as it was with Adam and Eve. So what do they believe about those of us who are non Jehovah's Witnesses? Since they do not believe in a literal hell, the rest of us will be annihilated and permanently perish.

As a Christian, I believe in the Trinity - One God, three distinct personalities in the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Jehovah's Witnesses do not believe in the Trinity: They believe they are separate entities, three separate individuals. They make their case by using the New World Translation, which was published in 1950 by Watch Tower Bible and Tract society. This is their version of the Bible with certain changes. They will for instance add a word that supports their interpretation. For example: John 1:1-2 says, *In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning.* The JW Bible says something different. It says the Word was a god, little g. Jesus is a god, not almighty like Jehovah. Jesus is not God, he is a god. They believe that Jesus originally was Michael the archangel who was with God in heaven, and then was transformed to Mary on earth to be the Christ child. They believe that he did not die on a cross, but on a torture stake and spiritually (not physically) was raised from the dead. This is significantly different from what we believe about Jesus as God, our Lord

and Savior.

What to do

Unless you are very well prepared and informed, do not try and debate with a JW. You are not prepared for it, and they are. They would love to take you into debate, because they have studied years for that and it's what they hope would happen. So redirect away from that.

Express your love and God's love for them. Don't slam the door, because that will only confirm in their minds their belief that they are being persecuted and right. Especially when you say you are a follower of Christ they will say, see they are lost. If you say you are a follower of Christ and show them love, it will cause them to doubt what they have been taught.

If they will let you, share how you became a follower of Christ. Most of the time they will not allow you the opportunity, but if they give you a chance, just share your story of how Christ has made a difference in your life.
